









Christian Hip-Hop and Rap

Manafest Announces New Album and Tours

PRESS RELEASE

Thursday, May 31st, 2012. International rock and hiphop artist Manafest, is planning on dropping his next studio project entitled Fighter. Working with Manafest on the production are Grammy-Nominated producers Adam Messinger (Justin Bieber, Chris Brown) and Seth Mosley. The album reflects struggles that Manafest and others, have been through in life, showing inspiration and hope that no one is alone. Growing up with only his mother after his father commit suicide, Manafest has been a fighter from a young age, and learned to get through insecurity and over coming what ever challenges that where presented in his life.

Following the release of the album, Manafest has back to back tours scheduled across the globe, with shows from Tokyo to London to British Colombia. Visit www.manafest.ca for shows coming near you throughout the summer and fall, and all things Manafest.

The album will be available in Japan for a promo release on April 8th, and internationally on April 10th.

Fighter is Manafest's fifth studio album, following the 2010 International hit The Chase. Manafest was born Chris Greenwood in Toronto, Canada, and is a ex-professional skateboarder, turned Christian rapper.





BEHIND THE MUSIC

HAME: CHRIS GREENWOOD

AKA: MANAFEST

Chris Greenwood was born in 1979, and raised in Pickering, Ontario, in Canada. At the age of 8, Chris' father took his own life leaving Chris to be raised by his mother. Chris states that from a young age "I was a quite, timid boy. I was shy growing up, and I never really got along with others, and would always be the quite kid in the corner you know?" (Manafest Live In Concert CD/DVD) Eventually, Chris took up skateboarding from high school and through early college years, between living at friends houses and partying. (Tooth & Nail Interview).

Spending his time working towards going professional in skating, Chris made it to a semi-pro skateboard organization, until an accidental injury in a skate park brought his carrier to an end. After not knowing what to do with his life, Chris spent a few months struggling until he found refuge in the Church and turned back to his family and old friends. "It was my epiphany in life and it changed me deep" He states in an interview (*Tooth & Nail Interview*). Chris eventually started singing rap and hip hop in different clubs and local open-mic nights throughout Ontario.

He was exposed to hip hop while skating at different parks and events, and said "I kinda fell in love with that style of music". Soon after he started, his talent was found by Trevor McNevan of Thousand Foot Krutch, and founder of Teerawk Records. Trevor then helped Chris get signed by a BEC Records, and 2005, after two EP releases, Chris Greenwood, now going by Manafest release his first album *Epiphany*. The album became a large hit in Canada and Japan, and was followed by his album *Glory* in 2007. In 2010, Manafest released *The Chase*, which blew up across the world, and lead to Manafest playing a total of over a thousand show across nine countries in his musical career and still stacking tours up for years to come. In 2012, Manafest released his newest album, *Fighter*, which became another large hit across the world, and had a double release, with *Fighter - Japan*, which was an alternate edit of the album made for Manafest's large number of japanese fans. Winning his way into the music world, Manafest is starting to leave his mark and only just beginning.(1cubed.com)



Manafest's songs Runaway and 4-3-2-1 are very different expressions of his skill and each show different sides of him as a singer and rapper. While Runaway is a soft expression of a broken story, 4-3-2-1 brings vibe and pumps up the energy written to be played loud; it is essentially his party anthem. They have similar set ups, as they are both made by the same mind. While Runaway was produced by aaron sprinkle, and 4-3-2-1 produced by Trevor McNevan of Thousand Foot Krutch.

Runaway sports three verses and tells the stories of different teenage runaway kids, who eventually find their way home. On the other hand, 4-3-2-1 is a three verse & bridge set up, with a verse after the bridge. The song describes Mana's "Ideal Party" as he describes in an interview (*Manafest - Behind The Music*), and he wrote to use as an intro for his concerts to get people pumped up and ready to rock. Runaway was written to get the idea across to peoples mind about some of the problems that teens have to deal with, and reflects some of the problems that Manafest had to deal with while he grew up as a teenager, struggling with life.

The two songs are very different from each other, from "Everyone to the dance floor, Everybody just rock tonight, Everybody just bounce if ye feeling hype, hey 4,3,2,1" In 4-3-2-1 to the "So I run, and I run, and I ran and I ran praying maybe some day we meet again, Cause It hurts when you hurt, and I hurt and I feel, like I'm healed can we all just make a mends" In Runaway. The chorus' echo feelings of different caliber, both making Manafest who he is.

ANALYZED

Written by Chris Greenwood (Manafest himself) and Seth Mosley, Never Let You Go, is the first single off of his new album Fighter (2012). The song starts with a soft, echoey quick build in from a keyboard effect, and acoustic guitar cords in the background with blend with vocals of "Ill never let you go, let you go" echoing till the start of the verse. They style of this song is unique to Manafest, as against his usual loud edgy rock/rap and hip-hop, its soft, and sung in a quite manner.

The keyboard and acoustic guitar continue through the verses. When the chorus comes in, the guitar fades out and is replaced by a louder, drum piece and a different keyboard rhythm, and a faint violin/string background is played through it as well. After the end of the chorus, a few piano notes lead into the second verse, which continues the echoey vocals and keyboard, but adds the drums in the background, and limits the acoustic guitar. Before the build to the chorus, a bells rhythm can be heard and then an echoed voice. At the bridge, the main phrase of the song concluded with "Ill never let you go" is heard with little background sounds, only the dreamy keyboard which is the base of the song, and some percussion instruments. The chorus is repeated once again, and then is finished with a fade out and the conclusion of the song.

Lyrics of the song reflect the struggle that Chris, (Manafest) had to deal with as a child growing up, and dives into the memories of when his father committed suicide when Chris was only 8 years old. He describes how he had to deal with pain and depression in life, and never felt like it was worth it. But he found refuge in his mother and his close friends and church who gave him the strength to stand strong in life. The song follows the theme of the album Fighter, on standing strong against pain and the story of his life, but also reflects his success and how he over came his fears. The song is well put together, and produced by Adam Messinger, who has produced multiple Platinum hit songs, albums, for Grammy Award Winning artists like Chris Brown, Justin Bieber, Ne-Yo, Michael Bolton and many more.







After two years, Manafest finally released his next studio record, in hopes to topple his previous album "The Chase". On April 9th, 2012, Fighter dropped in Japan with a special edition of the album, featuring japanese remixes, and exclusive songs. The next day, Fighter landed stateside, and internationally with

11 new songs. After the success and ratings on "The Chase" and some people doubted that Manafest could outshine it with Fighter. After the treacherous wait for iTunes to download the album, I sat down with some Beats By Dr. Dre and a can of AriZona and put my mind to the music. First of all, Fighter is different from "The Chase" and all other Manafest's albums and releases, with a lot less rap and a lot more rock. Hardcore fans might take this by surprise, but you get used to it fast and really sink into the music. Manafest's new approach to music in a hard rock form is a little disappointing, but is a work around. Songs like "Never Let You Go" and "Will You Catch Me" show a little bit of the soft side of Manafest, and balance the album out. Joel Bruyere of Thousand Foot Krutch, and The Drawing Room, donated his own talents and musical gift in crafting a remix for "Never Let You Go", which wraps up the record leaving a lasting impression and really is the icing on the cake. Fighter overall might not surpass "The Chase" in classic Manafest style, but it is a new gateway to a different side of Manafest, and it really is a great album.
